### Largemouth Bass **OUTLOOK: GOOD**

Good population of largemouth bass from 12 - 18 inches long. Fifty five percent of the fish were longer than 12" in spring electrofishing surveys. Fish channels, vegetated areas, and riprap for best catch rates. In spring target the channels where water warms up first for good early season catches.

### Crappie **OUTLOOK: GOOD**

Both black and white crappie are present in Indian Lake. Fall trap net sampling in 2008 indicated that 78% were black crappie and 22% are white crappie. Largest fish captured was a 12.25" black and a 13.2" white crappie. Almost 27% of black crappie were 9" or longer. Only 17% of white crappie were 9" or larger. Both species of crappie have strong 2008 year classes that should provide good fishing for several years.

### Saugeye **OUTLOOK: EXCELLENT**

Large population of saugeye. Sampling in fall 2009 showed a strong population with a wide range of ages and lengths. Average length of fish caught was 15" long. Thirty two percent of saugeye were 15" or longer with the largest fish 25.25" long. Moundwood and Old Indian Lake areas are good places to fish. Many fish are taken each year while ice fishing.

### Sunfish **OUTLOOK: GOOD**

Good population of bluegill. Thirty five percent of sunfish were 7 inches or larger. Good fishery in spring, try night crawlers, redworms, or maggots on a hook that is suspended by a float. During ice fishing try maggots in the Long Island area.
