Largemouth Bass **OUTLOOK: GOOD**

In a survey conducted in 2006, 43% of the largemouth bass sampled were 12-inches or larger, while 22% were 15-inches or larger.

Bluegill **OUTLOOK: POOR**

Bluegill were the predominate species sampled in the 2006 survey. This survey demonstrated low numbers, below average quality, with only 7% of the bluegill sampled being 6-inches or larger and no fish captured that were over 8-inches.

Channel Catfish **OUTLOOK: UNKNOWN**

Channel catfish yearlings are stocked in alternate years. The channel catfish population has not been investigated.

SPECIES **OUTLOOK: EXCELLENT**

Catchable rainbow trout are stocked each year in the early spring to provide another highly desirable sport fish opportunity.

NOTES:

This impoundment is also known as Slope Creek Reservoir. It is located 5 mile south of Barnesville, Ohio, off of McGinnis Road. Reservoir has a ramp at the dam end of the lake.
