### Largemouth Bass **OUTLOOK: GOOD**

The 2007 electrofishing survey at Lake Logan produced good numbers of bass. During the sample, 62% of the fish captured were 12-inches or larger. Similarly, 37% of the bass captured were 15-inches or larger.

### Channel Catfish **OUTLOOK: GOOD**

Channel catfish are popular with anglers based on recent creel survey data. Though catch rates were fair during the 2006 survey, sizes of channel catfish caught were excellent. Forty-seven percent of the fish captured were 16-inches or larger; 7% of the fish captured were 24-inches or larger.

### Bluegill **OUTLOOK: POOR**

Bluegill are abundant at Lake Logan but are small in size. During the 2008 survey, only 6% of the fish captured were six-inches or larger. Most bluegill are five-inches or less in length. A variety of sunfish species can be found at Lake Logan but bluegill are the predominant species.

### Saugeye **OUTLOOK: GOOD**

Lake Logan has been a consistent hot spot for saugeye in District Four. During the fall 2006 gillnet survey, good numbers of keeper sized saugeye were captured; 85% of the fish captured were 14-inches or larger. The beach area at night during the early spring and fall is a great spot for fishing as well as the dam rip-rap.

### Crappie **OUTLOOK FAIR**

Crappie are found in moderate abundance at Lake Logan. Twenty percent of the fish captured during the 2009 trapnet survey were eight-inches or larger. Spring fishing is best near brushy cover or fallen trees. Minnows under a bobber or small jigs are popular techniques with anglers.
